Lichtundfire is pleased to present and welcomes all to an Exhibition Walk Thru and second Reception for FLORA and FAWNA (deliberately spelled), on the occasion of LES Third Thursday (Lower East Side Galleries Open Late till 8 pm). FLORA and FAWNA, an exhibition of work in various media from Abstraction to Representation, including a number of phantasmagorical works, comments on the wide range of plant and animal life that enchants us during the summer months.

The exhibition alludes to all that stimulates our senses during the height of the summer — when the many scents become natural opiates, when animal life is in full swing and plant growth seems to overwhelm us. All that appeared fresh and light and new in the spring turns full and laden with the weight of blossoms, leaves and the intense cacophony of animal cries.

The artists in the exhibition reflect the concept both in their very own personal way as much as distinctively different from one another. What connects them is their interaction with the subject: rather than being mere observers of a season, they engage with it — seemingly mesmerized by the intangible luring them into the realm of a dream state, and taping into their fantasy and stimulating their imagination.

An exhibition that encompasses a wide visual range, FLORA and FAWNA encourages the viewer to look beyond the details and the differences in the individual expression and toward what echoes our very universal responses to our complex relationship with nature.

Such as in Shakespeare's *A Midsummer Night Dream* — the actors, here the various works, are the cast that develops its own narrative; a storyline that engulfs and mystifies us — one of the season's impact on all living before the fall takes it away—.
